POSTAL NEWS

The Homeland Security Committee is considering the nomination of Mr. Ron Stroman, Mr. Anton Hajjar, and Ms. Amber McReynolds to the Board of Directors of the USPS. Both are nominees of the Joe Biden administration. They are now before the Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee. A group of Congressmen introduced a bill in the House to prevent the changes that Postmaster General Louis DeJoy wants to bring to the service. This plan will slow down delivery of first-class mail and to stop the close of some locations.

Under the plan, seventy percent of first-class mail would take three days and thirty percent would take

five days. Moreover, President Joe Biden (D) nominated three people to the Postal Board of Governors, who potentially could fire DeJoy, a Trump administration holdover.

Senator Tammy Duckworth (D-III) has explicitly called for his firing in a letter to the board. She wrote: "[take] decisive action to stop PMG DeJoy from triggering a death spiral of plummeting service standards, plummeting customer satisfaction and plummeting revenue that will destroy the United States Postal Service."
